Successfully completing this course is one way to meet the requirements for a preventive controls qualified individual (PCQI), under the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) rules. Participants who are present for the entire course and actively participate in the exercises will receive a FSPCA certificate of completion (included in course registration cost). Why attend now? The FSMA Current Good Manufacturing Practice (CGMP) regulations became effective 9/19/2016 for companies with more than 500 employees. Small businesses with less than 500 full-time equivalent employees are required to be compliant with CGMP regulations starting 9/19/2017.
