


Hay Drop-Off/Pick-Up Points

VOLUNTEERS: If you are able to volunteer to load/unload or haul to nearby farms/ranches, call one of the following: Verdigre Livestock Market (Verdigre, NE), Nebraska State Fair/Fonner Park (Grand Island, NE), UNL Research Center at Mead (Ithaca, NE), and UNL Haskell Lab (Concord, NE).

DONATIONS: There is an urgent need for donations of hay, barbed wire fencing, wooden posts, and T-posts, inquire at the location you contact.

OTHER AVAILABLE SUPPLIES FOR PICK-UP: Some sites indicate they have additional supplies available, such as bagged livestock and horse feed, pet food, molasses licks, leather gloves, muck boots, etc. Contact individual sites for availability.

Coordinates are: 41.161543 -96.482925.

Enter from the EAST and exit to the WEST.

From Mead: 5 mi. South and ½ mi. West on Rd. H

From Hwy 66/Rd. 10: 1 mi. North and ½ mi. West

 - **Truck Permits**: If you have an oversized load on the Interstate, call 402-471-0034. NDOT will issue you a permit for free. There is no central hub of waived weight restrictions by State. Call either the State DOT's or carrier enforcement (varies by state, may be with the DOT or state law enforcement).
 - **Bridge Weight Restriction Map**: This map shows the weight restriction on ALL bridges. Be cautious of county roads – 511 does not show the county.
- Survivors who sustained damage or losses caused by the flooding and/or straight-line winds can register with **FEMA** in the following ways:
 - Online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov.
 - By phone using FEMA's toll-free registration line by calling 800-621-FEMA (3362). If you have a speech disability or hearing loss and use a TTY call 800-462-7585; or use 711 or Video Relay Service (VRS) to call 1-800-621-3362. Telephone registration is available 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., seven days a week.
- Carcass disposal questions should be directed to the **Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality** at 877-253-2603.
- Private well water test kits are available from the **Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality** by calling 877-253-2603.
- Further resources and assistance can be found by calling the **Nebraska Rural Response Hotline** at 800-464-0258. The Hotline is resource for individuals and families who may be feeling overwhelmed with stress, depression, or other mental health related issues.

USDA has several crews in place to remove carcasses of livestock that perished in the floods and blizzards in federal designated disaster areas. If you see deceased livestock you wish removed, please report it to the **Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality** at 877-253-2603 or the **Nebraska Department of Agriculture** at 800-831-0550 by April 15.
